Through a unique seven year program, Scouts learn valuable skills and develop friendships which will follow them for the rest of their lives. Scouts learn the values of citizenship, cooperation, courage, health and fitness, honesty, perseverance, resourcefulness, respect, and personal responsibility.

An Active Troop


- We currently have over 50 Boy Scouts and 50 active adult leaders and a very generous and loyal alumni base.
- Over 480 Scouts from Troop 25 have earned the rank of Eagle Scout.
- In addition to weekly meetings during the school year, Scouts go on seven weekend camping trips.
- Troop 25 owns its own camp, Camp Kirkham, located in southern New Hampshire. Scouts spend two weeks at summer camp in August.
- Scouts have the opportunity to become American Red Cross First Aid certified and ARC Lifeguard certified.


Program Highlights

- A structured seven year program keeps Scouts engaged in age-appropriate activities.
- Fifth-year Scouts hike a 55-mile section of the Appalachian Trail in New Hampshire.
- Sixth-year Scouts canoe a 100-mile section of the Connecticut River.
- Senior Scouts take a ski/snowboard trip each winter and participate in a Fall bike trip. Scouts that complete the full seven year program have the opportunity to spend a week in Bermuda.

Troop Strengths

- Since 1948, the Troop has had only four Scoutmasters.
- Continuity of leadership and an active staff. We take great pride in our ongoing leadership training.
- Troop Staff members are mountaineers, Appalachian Trail thru-hikers, water safety instructors, EMTs, SCUBA divers, hunters, archers, fishermen, Outward Bound graduates.
